President's Report - Wayne Todman



What an honor it has been to lead Redlands Tigers and Redlands Cricket throughout the 2020/21 cricket season. Presenting the 22nd annual report reflects a season that was more than a culmination of dedication, effort and hard work; more so, it reflected all who took on the mantra of being bold. At the season start I asked for the support of the entire playing group and the Redlands Cricket community. Emphatically, you responded, delivering results expected of a powerful club and community. Our goal was simple:

1. Win on the field
2. Win off the field
3. Foster a strong culture of respect, effort, and pride in our club.

These are the three key points that we as a club and a cricketing body worked hard to achieve throughout the season. By focusing on these simple points, we delivered more representative players, won three flags, delivered the "Outside the Locker Room" Initiative, revitalized women's cricket, started our first ever Redlands Tigers Cricket Academy and returned the club to a sound financial position.

It was an honor to see the implementation of QLD Crickets first ever "Outside the Locker Room" (OTLR) program. This program was the first of a two-year initiative to drive culture and was driven by players for players. The OTLR program asked us as a club to look after and keep an eye out for our mates. Simon Milenko, Jason Grosvenor, Matt Wheeler and James Cullen were instrumental in implementing this program and through their support, we as a club took a step closer to improving player welfare. This team will lead the second stage of this program which will challenge the playing group to build a stronger culture and to be better leaders. It's my hope that as a club we will not accept second best and build an even stronger culture.

It was an honor to work with our representative stars and see them all take our club to new levels on. Marnus Labuschagne reached new heights this season and cemented his place as one of Australia's premier batsmen. Jimmy Peirson played the talisman, leading the QLD Bulls and Brisbane Heat with class and distinction. Sam Heazlett reached new levels with the Brisbane Heat and claimed Tigers top honor with the club's "Best & Fairest" award. Simon Milenko returned to Tigerland and the Brisbane Heat while also claiming the "Club Champion" award. James Bazely celebrated his QLD Bulls and Brisbane Heat debut in style while Jack Sinfeld broke through and made the Brisbane Heat squad to show he will be a player of true quality in years to come.

It was an honor to work with our coaching staff, captains and players and challenge everyone to be bold. Redlands Tigers famously won the first grade one-day competition, fourth grade Bob Spence Shield and the sixth grade Wep Harris Shield. Third grade and fifth grade reached the semi-finals in two-day cricket

while fourth grade and fifth grade reached the one-day semi-finals. All players and grades were competitive and displayed a level of competitive tension at training not seen in years. We have laid the foundation at the club for greater success in years to come especially given our fields were once again, thanks to Chris Hepburn and Doug O'Neil, voted best in the QCA Premier grade competition.

It was an honor to witness our Redlands Tigers Women's cricket program revitalize and sow the seeds for future success. From barely filling a side to building a squad of energetic and honest girls with a true Tiger culture was a joy to be involved with. Led by our women's coach Neal Patterson, assistant coach Jason Grosvenor and Managers Scott Gosling and Mark Bradford; the girl's squad has evolved to ultimately field a strong Division 2 team, a Paul Pink team, and a Heat League side for the coming season. We as a club are proud of our players involved in the Wynnum/Redlands joint Division 1 team; we hope to field a Division 1 team in our own right the season after next.

It was an honor to start the first ever Redlands Tigers Cricket Academy and retool our winter cricket program. These initiatives will ensure Redlands Tigers constantly develops young players throughout the Redlands. Thanks must go to our core academy coaches and coaching coordinator Dan Cummins who have driven the academy sessions with professionalism and dedication to develop the young cricketers of the Redlands. Our marketing team who work mostly behind closed doors tripled their output making the club one of the most appealing and engaging cricket clubs through social media throughout the country. The Tigers marketing team was the envy of all QLD Cricket premier grade clubs. The Tigers canteen, the hub of our club; managed brilliantly by Paul Lavender was a beacon for the players both on and off the field. Shirley Kritzinger (Treasurer), Linda Pearson (Secretary), Matt Williamson (Volunteers), Sean Lloyd (Marketing), Dan Cummins (Juniors), Simon Milenko (Players Rep), Malcolm Lack (Community), Darren Wallis (Grants & IT) and Peter Ellis (Administrator) all played key roles in strengthening our club financially to establish a strong base for years to come.

Throughout the season I challenged our playing group, coaching team, committee, and volunteers to not accept a standard that does not represent our true Tigers culture. That is "the standard you walk past, is the standard you accept". Everyone lifted and responded, creating a special environment not seen at the club for years. We all have an opportunity to take these learnings and to continue this momentum, making the 2021/22 season a truly memorable season.

The Club held a special general meeting in January 2019 and past the motion to change the Club's financial year to January to December.



Executive Report

Redlands Tigers Cricket Club

During the 2020/21 season, Redlands Tigers fielded seven senior teams from 1st to 6th grades, a combined Redlands/Wynnum Women's first-grade team, a 2nd grade Women's team, a Lords Taverners U/16 team, a South East Youth Cup U/15 team and an O/40's master's team in the premier cricket competition. Despite the threat of Covid lockdowns player numbers remained high as did competition for places.

This year saw a number of team successes with Redlands Tigers winning the First Grade one-day competition early in the season with both Fourth Grade and Sixth Grade winning premierships for the Club. Redlands was also successful in again retaining the Mark Gaskell shield as part of the rivalry round. Numerous individual successes were achieved with both bat and ball and are detailed within this document.

Mark Rasmussen returned as head coach, and was again ably supported by Brad Wigney as his assistant. Dom Cassell took on the role of Chairman of Selectors, replacing Greg Moller.

On the back of Marnus' continued successes with Australia, Queensland and Brisbane, Redlands has also been proud to see Jimmy Peirson, Sam Heazlett, James Bazely and Jack Sinfield represent the Brisbane Heat with Jimmy Peirson continuing to represent the Queensland Bulls with James Bazely also being presented his Bulls cap for the first time. Proving the depth is deep at Redlands young guns Dylan Kritzinger, Stephan Muller and Jack Sinfield gained selection into the Queensland U19 team with Taverners captain James Puller being awarded a place in the U16 Australian team.

Behind the scenes, the committee members and volunteers continue to work towards delivering improvements to the club and infrastructure and ensuring the financial foundations are in place to protect us from the next unforeseen pandemic .

RCI Affiliate Clubs

Redlands Cricket would like to acknowledge the committees and numerous volunteers from our RCI Affiliate Clubs — Wellington Point, Muddies, Alexandra Hills, Cleveland Thornlands, John Paul College and Victoria Point Sharks for their contribution to junior and sub-district cricket in the Redlands.

In general, local clubs continue to fare well at junior level and at senior sub-districts levels. As per 2019/2020 junior numbers were strong across only two clubs, with the majority continuing to struggle for adequate numbers. Senior numbers remain reasonably stable, which is a positive sign. RCI local affiliate clubs are required to be the backbone of junior cricket recruitment and early age training and more needs to be done to boost and retain junior numbers across our catchment area over the coming years.

The link between Schools and Clubs is constantly being addressed with a greater presence of Queensland Cricket personnel and the greater participation of girls in cricket.

Facilities and Assets

The Tigers grounds at RCI Headquarters are still rated amongst the best overall in the premier cricket competition. Since starting at Tigers this year, Chris Hepburn has continued the tradition set before him of presenting outstanding fields and pitches with the help of Doug O'Neil. Chris and Doug won the "Groundsman of the Year" award for the first time as a team adding to the two before.

Renovations of all three ovals and wicket blocks commenced at the end of the season with assistance from Redlands City Council in top dressing and aerating. The staggering of block repairs ensures the facility is used all year round, with masters, seniors and juniors enjoying winter cricket.

Carnivals

Redlands was again the destination of choice in 2020/2021 for Cricket Australia, Queensland Cricket and Queensland's Schools to host several training events and cricket carnivals at our facilities. Although heavily impacted by Covid restrictions and indeed the weather we successfully hosted, Australian Womens squad training/practice matches, WBBL Heat squad training/practice matches, U15 Girls State Carnival, U15 Girls Schools Carnival and U19 Schoolboys Championships.

Again, many thanks must be given to Paul Lavender for his numerous hours spent organising, managing and catering for these events and the volunteers who helped throughout the working week to ensure these events were successful.

The volunteer support group across all Redlands Clubs is enormous. Each club committee is quick to recognize this, and from an RCI Management Committee perspective, volunteers cannot be thanked enough.

This year our “Club Person of the Year” award was shared by our marketing team of Nick Hurford, Leigh Drennan and Matt Fay for their outstanding contribution to the marketing of all things “Tigers”. The quality of the social media posts does not happen quickly, and many hours of work go into the production of one slide.

Special mention must again go to Paul Lavender whose commitment to the club is extraordinary. The time he commits to the successful management of the entire operation, is remarkable.

Others who have continued to lift well beyond their weight in the volunteer stakes are Brad Stewart, Rob Anderson and Peter Ellis and should be recognised for their weekly efforts both during and off season.

Redlands Tigers Cricket Academy

After many stop-start attempts at developing a professional junior cricket coaching academy the Redlands Tigers Cricket Academy was successfully launched on February 1, 2021, with the initial eight (8) - week Academy attracting a huge response with numbers having to be capped at 44 participants. This success continued with an additional two (2) Academy programs held simultaneously in May with over 70 participants. With multiple programs now scheduled for July and October dates the Academy is on track to train over 200 participants in less than 12 months. With the Academy to date (6 months) being responsible for a \$25K injection into the bottom line, it now represents a significant income source.

The professionalism and success of the Academy has many to thank. The management team of Peter Ellis, Dan Cummins and Paul Lavender who developed, implemented and ran the initial program and subsequent programs. The coaches Liam Smith, Jasper Sumner, Jason Grosvenor, Stephan Muller, Dylan Kritzing, Bailey Lavender, Carter Pearson, James Pullar, Brent Pullar, Hunter Ellis and Brayden Laffan who all provided professional training and mentoring to their squads. The Redlands Tigers profile players Marnus Labuschagne, Simon Milenko, Sam Heazlett, James Bazely and Jack Sinfield who attended numerous sessions in their own time to provide additional coaching to the participants. To Simon Milenko (Icon Sports) for designing and supplying the kit, Ryley Morton (GSM Press) for marketing design and production and Academy Sponsors, Physio on Bayside and Jeffries Builders we extend our heartfelt thanks to all for contributing to this great success.
